forgive us all our offenses;


and grant that we may serve you

- 5 Into your hands I commend my spirit, * for you have redeemed me, O Lord, O God of truth.


Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: * as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.






