

On September 10, storm Daniel hit Libya hard with high winds, strong rains and flash flooding that caused the collapse of two dams, devastated numerous cities and towns, and killed more than 4,000 people. Unfortunately, that number is sure to rise as recently revised reports from the U.N. Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs indicate more than 9,000 people are still missing.

Episcopal Relief & Development is joining with <u>DanChurchAid</u> (DCA) and their local partners to save lives and strengthen resilience. With a focus on communities around Derna and Benghazi, Episcopal Relief & Development supports DCA in providing shelter, non-food items such as blankets and hygiene kits, and mental health support to 2,000+ survivors of the storm Daniel disaster.

On September 8, a devastating 6.8-magnitude earthquake struck Morocco, killing almost 3,000 people with the number of deceased persons still growing. Episcopal Relief & Development is partnering with the <u>International Blue Crescent Relief and</u> <u>Development Foundation</u> (IBC) to provide relief to over 10,000 survivors of the disaster who have left the area of impact for safer grounds.

Episcopal Relief & Development is supporting IBC, an organization with over 20 years of experience responding to crises, in providing food, hygiene products, tents, medical supplies, flashlights and items for mothers and babies in Chichaoua, Morocco. The aid is reaching extremely rural and hard-to-reach villages (also known as "last mile" communities) for whom a lack of resources has contributed to weak infrastructure that is especially vulnerable to earthquakes.

The earthquake was the strongest to hit the area in a century, and the full scale of its impact is still unfolding. 
