

The First Lesson

Isaiah 61:1-9

The First Lesson is read in Haitian Creole by Jacques Joseph, a member of the Cathedral Choir

The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; to provide for those who mourn in Zion— to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the LORD, to display his glory. They shall build up the ancient ruins, they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations. Strangers shall stand and feed your flocks, foreigners shall

till your land and dress your vines; but you shall be called priests of the LORD, you shall be named ministers of our God; you shall enjoy the wealth of the nations, and in their riches you shall glory. Because their shame was double, and dishonor was proclaimed as their lot, therefore they shall possess a double portion; everlasting joy shall be theirs. The Sermon

The Right Reverend Lawrence C. Provenzano, Bishop of Long Island

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE BLESSING AND CONSECRATION OF HOLY OILS (All remain standing)

Bishop Dear Friends in Christ: In the beginning, the Spirit of God hovered over the creation; and, throughout history, God, by the gift of the Holy Spirit, has empowered people to serve him. As a sign of that gift, the priests and kings of Israel were anointed with oil; Our Lord Jesus was himself anointed with the Holy Spirit at his Baptism as the Christ, God's own Messiah; and Holy Scripture teaches us that, following His example, Jesus' disciples laid hands upon and anointed the sick as a witness to the marvelous power and presence of God. Let us now set apart the Oils of Unction, Catechumen, and Chrism.

THE OIL FOR THE SICK

Intoned by Cantor, repeated by ALL, first time only



- *Cantor* From fruitful olive tree this oil has come, a sign of life and healing. We bring it now before you, O Lord, and humbly ask your blessing. *Antiphon*
- Bishop O Lord, holy Father, giver of health and salvation: Send your Holy Spirit to sanctify this oil; that, as your holy apostles anointed many that were sick and healed them, so may those who in faith and repentance receive this holy unction be made whole; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.
 People Amen.
- *Cantor* Behold now the oil which will be for anointing of the sick.

THE OIL FOR CATECHUMENS



- *Cantor* Lord, by this sacramental oil, you sanctify and bless your people. Unite us now in charity, who share one hope and calling. *Antiphon*
- *Bishop* Holy God, protector of all who believe in you, bless this oil and give wisdom and strength to all who are anointed with it in preparation for their baptism. Bring them to a deeper understanding of the gospel and lead them to the joy of new birth, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

THE OIL OF CHRISM



Cantor May all anointed with this sacred oil receive the grace of your Holy Spirit. May light and everlasting life come to all who share this Chrism. *Antiphon*

A period of silence is kept as the Bishop adds the fragrance to the oil. The Bishop then breathes upon the oil and places a hand upon the vessel and prays:

Bishop Eternal Father, whose blessed Son was anointed by the Holy Spirit to be the Savior and servant of all, we pray you to consecrate this oil, that those who are sealed with it may share in the royal priesthood of Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever.

Cantor Behold now the holy Chrism: all those anointed with it in the splendor of holiness will shine on the world.

The Reaffirmation of Discipleship & Renewal of Ordination Vows

All remain standing. The Bishop addresses the people, saying

- *Bishop* Beloved in Christ, through baptism we were all called to new life in the risen Lord. In baptism, we promised to proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ; according to the gifts given to us, to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world; and to take our place in the life, worship, and governance of the church. I call upon you, therefore, to reaffirm your commitment to follow the way of Jesus Christ.
- *Bishop* Do you reaffirm the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism, renouncing all that seeks to corrupt and destroy the creatures of God, and promising to serve God faithfully as the Body of Christ in the world?
- All We do.
- *Bishop* Will you bear witness to Christ wherever you may be and, according to the gifts given you, carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world?

All We will, with God's help.

The bishops remain standing, while all others are seated; Dr. Lena Mullings, a lay person and member of the Commission on Ministry, addresses the bishops, saying

- Lay person My brothers and sister, you have been called to be one with the apostles in proclaiming Christ's resurrection and interpreting the Gospel, and to testify to Christ's sovereignty as Lord of all. So I ask:
- Lay Person Will you continue to guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church?
- *Bishops* I will, with God's help.
- *Lay Person* Will you continue to celebrate and provide for the administration of the sacraments of the New Covenant?
- *Bishops* I will, with God's help.
- *Lay Person* Will you continue to ordain priests and deacons and to join in ordaining bishops?
- *Bishops* I will, with God's help.
- *Lay Person* Will you continue to be in all things a faithful pastor and a wholesome example for the entire flock of Christ?
- *Bishops* I will, with God's help.

The bishops are seated and the priests stand; the Bishop addresses them, saying

- *Bishop* My colleagues, each of you has been called by God to work as a pastor, priest, and teacher, together with your bishop and fellow presbyters, and to take your share in the councils of the Church. And so I ask:
- *Bishop* Will you continue to proclaim by word and deed, the Gospel of Jesus Christ?
- *Priests* I will, with God's help.

Bishop	Will you continue to fashion your life in accordance with its precepts?
Priests	I will, with God's help.
Bishop	Will you continue to love and serve the people among whom you work, caring alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor?
Priests	I will, with God's help.
Bishop	Will you continue to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to penitent sinners, to pronounce God's blessing, to share in the administration of Holy Baptism and in the celebrations of the mysteries of Christ's Body and Blood, and to perform the other ministrations entrusted to you?

MUSIC NOTES

The **opening voluntaries** are Lenten chorale preludes by composers from France and the UK. The first is a setting of the chant hymn for Lent, *Attende Domine*, written by Jeanne Demessieux, one of the most significant organ virtuosos of the Twentieth Century. The second, *Was Gott tut, das ist wohlgetan,* is by Roxanna Panufnik, a British composer of Polish descent. She is particularly known for her choral music. In 2023, Panufnik was one of twelve composers asked to write a new piece for the coronation of Charles III and Camilla.

The **hymnody** today in taken from The Hymnal 1982 and LEVAS II, representing a full picture of current musical practice in The Episcopal Church.

The **Communion Hymn** *Taste and See* is the best-known work of the Black composer James Moore. After finishing a doctorate degree in choral conduction at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, Moore taught first at the Athenaeum of Ohio, a Roman Catholic seminary, before moving permanently to Vienna in 1984, where he directed a university choir for several years before becoming a full time singing and conducting teacher.

The **Offertory Anthem**, *Eternal Light* by the American composer Leo Sowerby, is a brief setting of an ancient text from the 700's. Sowerby won the Pulitzer Prize for Music in 1946 and was often called the "Dean of American church music" in the early to mid-20th century. The **Communion Motet**, *We adore you*, *O Christ*, was written by Richard Proulx, one of the foremost liturgical musicians of the past decades. As one of the editors of The Hymnal 1982, he had a significant impact on both congregational music as well as works for choir. He was director of music at Holy Name Cathedral (Roman Catholic) in Chicago during the aftermath of Vatican II, re-establishing a great choral program there. I would add that I worked with Richard as Associate Organist/Choirmaster from 1982-92, before moving to the Episcopal Church.

The **service music** also comes from a wide variety of sources. The Trisagion and Memorial Acclamation both come from Ukraine, the Trisagion from the western part of the country (Galicia) and the Memorial Acclamation from Kyiv. The music for the acclamation is frequently misattributed as Russian Orthodox, which it is not – it is of Ukrainian origin. The Sanctus setting is taken from the Missa Guadalupe by Joel Martinson, one of the few settings which uses both English and Spanish. The setting of the Agnus Dei, taken from the LEVAS II, is

by Marjorie Landsmark-DeLewis. More than five decades since receiving a degree as one of Juilliard's first African-American graduates, she occupies a special place in the ranks of American dance musicians. Over the course of her distinguished career, she worked as rehearsal pianist for the American Ballet Theater, and served as music director for dance at Sarah Lawrence College.

The **postlude** today is by Jehan Alain, a French organist and composer who died in the line of duty in World War II. Litanies features an energetic, rhythmic idea which permeates most of the piece. It was written in 1939, near the beginning of Alain's time in the French army. He accompanied the piece with the following poetic incipit, which beautifully reflects our faith journey during Lent:

When the Christian soul finds in its distress no further words to implore the mercy of Almighty God, it repeats the same words without ceasing. Reason reaches its limit. Only faith ascends.

ABOUT THE OILS BEING BLESSED TODAY

Oil of the Sick (Oleum Infirmorum)

The oil of the sick is fragranced with lavender - an old translation of the Hebrew *nard* and Greek *nardos*. The NRSV now uses "nard" in its translation. It is possible that lavender was a similar yet more readily available alternative to the more expensive spikenard, which was native to far away India.

The anointing at Bethany mentions the nard fragrance, and as such the aroma retains its importance in the anointing of the sick or dying:

While he was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he sat at the table, a woman came with an alabaster jar of very costly ointment of nard, and she broke open the jar and poured the ointment on his head. *Mark 14:3

Oil of the Catechumen (Oleum Sanctorum)

The oil of the catechumen is fragranced with sandalwood, a scent which is mentioned in scripture. Sandalwood is now translated as "aloes" and is a translation of the Hebrew 'ahalot or 'ahalim and Greek smurna (aloe). Not to be confused with aloe vera, which is an American plant, aloes is known to support mental clarity, joy, and rest.

God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of gladness beyond your companions; your robes are all fragrant with myrrh and aloes and cassia. *Psalm 45:7

Holy Chrism (Sacrum Chrisma)

Olive oil, the base oil of the three holy oils, is augmented with essence of balsam - a symbol of sweetness of Christian virtue and strength. The chrism is the gift of the Holy Spirit, the "aroma of Christ," and its use to consecrate someone or something to God's service has ancient roots.

For we are the aroma of Christ to God among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing. *2 Corinthians 2:15
